





**Data from 1970s survey**

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The picture above is an aerial view of 1957 copied from framed picture owned by Clarence Ballard. It shows that the barn was built separately in two parts. The section on the left above was once situated down by the Quinatisset Brook. About 1870 it was put on log rollers and hauled to its present position by several yokes of oxen. Clarence Ballard stated that the barn section down that was moved had the date "1815" on one sill. Black & white pictures from the OSV survey circa 1970 and color pictures taken 2010.

In 1845 the farm comprised 110 acres. The first Ballard came in 1630 followed by seven more; five men and two women who lived in Saugus then part of the Massachusetts Bay Colony. The family moved to Dudley and later to Thompson. There was a grist mill on the Quinatisset Brook and the ruins can still be seen






There is no sign of these two barns on Blash Road. However Blash Road quickly becomes Chandler School Road in Woodstock and there is a large farm just over the border. There are several new barns and buildings associated with the big dairy business. None of these buildings resemble the two barns from the 1970s pictures in age or design. It is believed that the 1970s barns were located over the border and that perhaps they were demolished to make room for new structures.

The original barn was torn down in the late 1930s by Allen and Robert Reynolds (great-grandchildren of Ellen and Nathan Chase). They put a roof over the foundation and started their welding business there. Today it is the machine shop of Reynolds and Sons.





### **Pictures from the 1930s**

The barn in the background was beside an ice house. In the foreground is the carriage shed. Nathan Chase is standing in front of the carriage shed so this photo is prior to 1920. Perhaps his grandchildren or great-grandchildren are standing in the doorway of the barn

A deed dated Dec. 1834 lists a house, barn and sawmill on this property. So possibly this barn was there at that time.

The next deed dated Apr. 1836 lists house, barn, sawmill and shingle mill Valentine Ballard purchased the property Aug. 3, 1838 and deeded the property to his daughter, Ellen S. Chase (wife of Nathan Chase). Thus the name is given to the property as Ballard-Chase.

This is a three-bay 1 1/2-story gable-roofed structure with its ridge-line oriented east-west and its principal entry in the north eave-side. There appears to be a lower level opening to the south side. The entry is a pair of out-swinging hinged barn doors in the center bay of the north side. Above the doors is a transom opening consisting of a top-hinged shutter the width of the door.

The west gable-end has a small vent opening near the peak of the roof and a 1-story shed-roofed addition the full width of the gable-end. In the north end of the shed a pair of hinged doors fills nearly the width of the gable-end wall. The west eave-side of the shed is blank. Grade slopes down gradually toward the west and south, with the floor elevation of the shed addition located below the main floor level. There appear to be basement windows exposed along the south eave-side wall, and a hay door opening above. The east gable-end appears to be blank. Information from the Sturbridge survey of 1978 indicates chestnut square-rule post and beam framing. Siding is vertical flush-boards painted red with white-painted bands representing an appearance of trim at the corners, eaves, and surrounding the doors. A white-painted board trims the siding along the rakes. Roofing is asphalt shingles and a weather vane is located at the west end of the roof ridge. The foundation appears to be fieldstone.


